... So what are these 'cookies' you speak of?

Well...cookies are little crumbs of information that websites and other online services drop onto your computer or device when you visit them. They range in their mission:

Then we have the 'Ugly' cookies, these are known as malicious cookies and can be used to instruct your browser to redirect to a hacker's site and download a virus or worse.

Well now that we have explored the Good, the bad and the ugly, we have now got to tell you what we use and how we use them for our services.

XaaS Website

We use 'good' cookies to manage logged-in user sessions and authentication. We also use cookies to remember a user's name and email address when filling out forms.

Alongside this we use 'good but selfish' third-party cookies from Google to provide useful analytic information to help us improve our service to you.

Metacore-X Platform

For now, we don't use cookies but at some point, we may use some analytic cookies to help improve our services to you, at which point we will update you. We do however use something call local browser storage.

Local browser storage is a space in your browser's memory dedicated to storing tiny bits of information that help us make your experience smoother. We don't store anything more than where you last left off to make your life easier and we don't record how you answered questions or anything that could be considered sensitive.
